



An Advertisement from His MAJESTIE'S Post-office.

All Gendem:n and others are defired to take notice. That the office leath been abused by several persons, who have fallely pretended them-felves to be appointed to receive Letters from the Post-Office, and have exacted a penny a Letter above the die Port, alledging it to be for carrying the same to the Office; and some such persons have also destroyed many letters to gain the port to themselves.

And to prevent the like abuses, his Majesties Post-Master general hath appointed the persons hereafter named at his own changes, who have given security and voluntary Outh so their faithfulhest to receive all Letters in their respective places for the Post-Office; vizy we spinisters, Mr. Parker at Mr. Geine Is Shop a Grocer, next door to the Santuary Gate. Strand, Mr. Roberts a Grocer at the Bay tree over against York house. Count-Garden, Mr. Mign's Stationer in Rolf-I-street. Holborn, Mr. Place Stationer at Grayes-Inn-gate. Fleet-street, Mr. Eules in St. Dunstans Churchyard.

And if any of the faid perions should happens to forfeit their security by exacting mo ether the due ports its defined that complaint may be made thereof at the Post Office, and that redress may be given to the parties injured.

And to prevent any neglect of the Letter carriers in the speedy delivery of Letters from the said Office, it's natified that the dayes of the receipt of every letter at the Office is praced upon the Letter; and the Letter-carryers ought to del ve them the same day in the Samuer, and the next mornine at farthest in the Water; and if any sayler be complained of at the Post Office, it shall be redressed.

It is likewise notified that the Office for the Kent sh daily Post is now kept at the Round House in Love Lane was B llingate, for the conceniency of Trading into that County. And all Letters into Kent delivered at the Kings general Post-Office shall be sent thether daily.


First Postmaster-General of the United Kingdom, 1660-1663, who wrote:
